It is that time of year again to prepare the town's budget. Mayor and Council are working to keep the tax rate the same. However, trying to maintain infrastructure will be difficult. Streets require a lot of upkeep, and this winter is taking a toll on all of them. The Governor is trying to reinstate some of the Highway Revenues to the municipalities.

The State has grant money available that is designated for certain types of projects. You may see the town working on the walking trail or something you may not think is important, but when the state has money for special programs, that is the only place where the money can be spent. Walking trails and parks are of high importance to state budgets. Having trails and parks get people out and moving and helps their overall health.

Economic development in town would be great for the tax rate. Everybody has ideas of what kind of businesses they would like to see in town. The problem is space available and the cost of doing business. Small businesses have a hard time thriving in small towns. Most of our town's businesses are experiencing the same problem. The large shopping centers have hurt the small shops. We must all try and support the local businesses in our town and neighboring towns.

GRANT PROJECTS UPDATE

Wetlands Park Trail Extension

The Town of Union Bridge has been awarded grant funding from Maryland Program Open Space and Maryland Community Parks and Playgrounds programs for the planned final phase of the trail system in the town's Wetlands Park located off of RT. 75. The town plans to start the project in the spring of 2015. Once complete, the trail will "loop" around the park.

USDA Vehicle Truck Purchase

The Town of Union Bridge has been awarded a grant from the United States Department of Agriculture for \$37,500 for the purchase of a multi-purpose municipal vehicle for town use. The town will purchase the vehicle from Crouse Ford. We should have the vehicle delivered to the town by spring.

Maryland Energy Administration Backup Generator

Union Bridge completed a grant application to the Maryland Emergency Management Agency for the purchase and installation of an emergency backup generator for the Town's Water Treatment Facility.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT TOWN ELECTIONS:

Voter Registration: It is necessary to be registered in order to vote in Town elections. If you are already registered with the County to vote in County, State, and Federal elections, you are automatically registered to vote in Town elections. If you wish to vote in only the Town election you may register at the Town Hall during regular hours, 8 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. **Registration will close on Saturday, April 11, 2015 at 4:00 p.m.**

Qualification of voters:

- 1. You must be a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You must be at least eighteen (18) years of age on or before Election Day.
- 3. You must have resided within the corporate limits at least thirty (30) days prior to the election.
- 4. You must be registered to vote.

Qualification of Candidates for Mayor and Council:

- 1. You must have resided within the corporate limits for at least one (1) year.
- 2. You must be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- 3. You must be a qualified voter of the Town.

Terms of office are for four (4) years

A candidate for office must file a "Certificate of Nomination" with the Town Clerk, no later than 4:00 p.m. on Monday, April 13, 2015.
