GRANT PROJECTS UPDATE

Wetlands Park Trail Extension

I hope everyone has had a chance to see and use the completed trail system at the Union Bridge Wetlands Park. This new trail section is part of a multi-phase walking and biking trail that has been in progress since 2001. The park now has over a mile of trail that meanders through the town's natural 54-acre park. The Wetlands Park has several unique natural features that go along with our ongoing preservation improvements including:

- A large and diverse young forest, developed through a Carroll County coordinated reforestation program with the planting of over 5,000 trees.
- The Little Pipe Creek meanders through the length of the property. The Town restored approximately 2,500 linear feet of the eroded stream banks and stream channel.

- The stream has forested areas and vegetative cover along the banks to cool the water temperature and encourage growth of fish populations (completed with the cooperation of Maryland Department of Natural Resources).
- The park has over 85,000 square feet of restored wetland areas, adding to Carroll County's and DNR's goal to restore lost wetlands and maintain water quality.
 - The park has a high population of diverse bird species for bird watching.
 - The park is accessible for handicapped individuals.

The Town hopes this trail system will allow students, residents, and visitors to explore the complete park and all its natural wonders.

PUBLIC ELECTION NOTICE

TO THE CITIZENS OF UNION BRIDGE: Three members of the council will be elected.

Election day is Tuesday May 9, 2017 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.

LOCATION: Town Hall 104 West Locust St.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT TOWN ELECTIONS:

Voter Registration: It is necessary to be registered in order to vote in Town elections. If you are already registered with the County to vote in County, State, and Federal elections, you are automatically registered to vote in Town elections. If you wish to vote in only the Town election you may register at the Town Hall during regular hours, 8 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Monday through Friday. Registration will close on Saturday, April 9, 2017 at 4:00 p.m.

Qualification of voters:

- 1. You must be a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You must be at least eighteen (18) years of age on or before Election Day.
- 3. You must have resided within the corporate limits at least thirty (30) days prior to the election.
- 4. You must be registered to vote.

Qualification of Candidates for Mayor and Council:

- 1. You must have resided within the corporate limits for at least one (1) year.
- 2. You must be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- 3. You must be a qualified voter of the Town.
- ***Terms of office are for four (4) years***

A candidate for office must file a "Certificate of Nomination" with the Town Clerk, no later than 4:00 p.m. on Monday, April 10, 2017.

WINTER MONTHS

Be sure to drain all outdoor water hoses and temporary water lines. Check all outdoor faucets to make sure they are turned off and are not leaking.

WINTER MAINTENANCE AND CARE OF PATTERN SIDEWALKS

- 1. Sand or kitty litter may be used for traction.
- 2. Snow removal equipment should have a rubber edged blade.
- 3. We do not recommend the use of salt or snow melting product containing sodium chloride. In the event that these products must be used wash any residue from the concrete surface when feasible.
- 4. Avoid the use of ice picks or anything that may chip or damage the concrete surface.

REMINDER: UNION BRIDGE CODE CHAPTER 130, SEC. 4 (B2)

Owners or occupants of premises fronting on any street with paved sidewalks shall remove any snow or ice from the traveled portions of the sidewalk, to a width of at least 30", within 24 hours after snow or ice ceases to fall.

SNOW

Main Street is a snow emergency route.

NO PARKING is allowed when the snow emergency plan is in effect.

NO PARKING on East Broadway from Lightner Street up to Bellevue and on Thomas Street up to Bellevue when the snow emergency plan is in effect.
