Wetlands Park Trail Extension

The Town of Union Bridge has been awarded a \$40,000 grant from the Maryland State Highway Association's NRT program and a \$36,000 grant from the Maryland Program Open Space program to complete our looped trail system at the

Little Pipe Creek Wetlands Park. This project will extend the length of the Little Pipe Creek Wetlands hiking and fitness trail an additional 1,100 feet (approximately).

Be sure to drain all outdoor water hoses and temporary water lines. Check all outdoor faucets to make sure they are turned off and are not leaking.

#### **ORDINANCE 311**

On September 28, 2015 the Union Bridge Town Council approved Floodplain Management Ordinance No. 311. The Town of Union Bridge has delegated the administration of floodplain management, plans and permit review and code enforcement to Carroll County as provided for in the Union Bridge Code and in a signed and executed Joint Resolution adopted between The Town of Union Bridge and The County Commissioners of Carroll County. A copy of Ordinance No. 311 is on display at the Town Hall.

# INDOOR WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

1. On average, toilets are responsible for 25% of your indoor water use. Installing a high-efficiency certified toilet can create significant water savings.

2. Taking shorter showers can help reduce your household's overall water usage. Consider switching to a low-flow showerhead to save on water. Five minutes in the shower equates to 50 gallons of water down the drain.

3. Run the dishwasher and washing machine when each is at full capacity to save on unnecessary water usage. Doing so can save up to 1,000 gallons of water a month.

4. When buying new appliances, consider those that offer cycle and load size adjustments. These are more water and energy efficient.

5. Replace and retrofit old faucets with high efficiency ones.

- 6. Listen for dripping and running toilets. Fixing a leak can save 300 gallons or more a month.
- 7. Don't leave the water running when brushing your teeth, shaving or washing dishes.
- 8. Use leftover water from cooking pasta or vegetables to water indoor plants.
- 9. Run your garbage disposal sparingly. Compost vegetable food waste instead and save gallons of water each time

IMPORTANT: If anyone notices anyone stealing water from hydrants or any unauthorized appropriation of water, please call the Town Hall at 401-775-2711.

# WINTER MAINTENANCE AND CARE OF PATTERN SIDEWALKS

- 1. Sand or kitty litter may be used for traction.
- 2. Snow removal equipment should have a rubber edged blade.
- 3. We do not recommend the use of salt or snow melting product containing sodium chloride. In the event that these products must be used wash any residue from the concrete surface when feasible.
- 4. Avoid the use of ice picks or anything that may chip or damage the concrete surface.

# **REMINDER: UNION BRIDGE CODE CHAPTER 130, SEC. 4 (B2)**

Owners or occupants of premises fronting on any street with paved sidewalks shall remove any snow or ice from the traveled portions of the sidewalk, to a width of at least 30", within 24 hours after snow or ice ceases to fall.

# SNOW

Main Street is a snow emergency route.

NO PARKING is allowed when the snow emergency plan is in effect.

**NO PARKING** on East Broadway from Lightner Street up to Bellevue and on Thomas Street up to Bellevue when the snow emergency plan is in effect.
