The town has completed a total rehabilitation of the basketball court on Ladiesburg Road including new court surface, gates, backboards, and installation of new court lighting. Use of the lighting is free. There is an automatic turnoff at 10:00pm. Funding for these improvements is through the Town, Carroll County, and Maryland Program Open Space.

Batting Cage Electric Service:

New electric service was installed to the batting cage next to the tennis courts. Also included was the purchase of an electronic pitching machine.

Community Park Trail System and Fitness Stations:

With funding through the Town, Carroll County, Program Open Space, and Community Parks and Playgrounds, a new sixfoot- wide paved trail system will be constructed by spring of 2009. In addition, fitness stations will be installed along the paved trail.

Farquhar Street Sidewalks: The Town received a \$195,000 grant from the Maryland Community Development Block Grant Program to install new sidewalks and curbing on Farquhar Street. This is in addition to Carroll County improvements which include removal of the railroad tracks and restoration of the street.

Other:

The Town is seeking funds to acquire and construct a multipurpose field. We are working in conjunction with the Union Bridge Rec. Council on this project.

HERITAGE COMMITTEE

Friends Meeting House open to the public. All are invited to tour the historic Friends Meeting House, which was the first house of worship built in the community in 1771. Most of the interior woodwork of the structure was destroyed by fire in 1932, and it was rebuilt similar to the original building. The adjoining graveyard was enclosed by a substantial stone fence in 1891.

The Union Bridge Area Heritage Committee has arranged for a tour of this historic structure and grounds on Thursday, September 4, at 7:00 p.m. Refreshments will be served. PATTERN SIDEWALKS

Recommended cleaning procedures.

- 1. Sweep or use blower to clean surface.
- 2. May be washed with mild, non-abrasive soap and warm water.
- 3. Soft bristle brush may be used for stubborn marks.

4. NO CHEMICALS should be used. (i.e. fertilizers, weed killers, acids, and strong cleaners containing bleach or ammonia.)
