Spring is here and it's time for cleaning up and mowing. Lets not forget that the town has laws pertaining to mowing and abandoned cars. Remember, that enforcing these rules cost money. The town sends notices to people by registered mail for record keeping practices, that way when a person gets a notice they can't come back and say that they didn't get it.

Don't forget about the curfew ordinance. Ordinance #272 states that curfew hours during the week are from 10:00pm until 6:00am. Fines for violation of curfew are not less than \$15.00, nor exceed \$300.00. A citation may be issued to a minor who is in violation or a parent that permits a minor to be in any public place during curfew hours due to a lack of sufficient control.

Bike and skateboard riders will be reminded about helmets. This is for your own safety.

May will be the last breakfast for the Funding Committee until fall. I would like to thank all those people who helped at the breakfast and fixing things for the bake table.

May 30th will be the fireman's parade. This year the parade route has changed. The town is asking for **NO PARKING** on North Main Street from North Main and Rt. 75 to Broadway, West Broadway to Whyte Street. Residents are asked not to park vehicles on these streets from 5pm until after the parade. Also, please do not put trash out until after the parade. Thank You.

The planning commission welcomes and encourages citizen comments regarding the proposed master plan update. A town plan update is required by Article 66 B of the Annotated Code of Maryland and Maryland Smart Growth legislation. A copy of the current town plan, adopted in 1990, is also available at the town office for review. The adopted plan will guide the growth and development of the town for several years into the future.
