THE TOWN OF UNION BRIDGE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES November 28, 2022

The Council met in the Union Bridge Town Hall, on Monday, November 28, 2022 at 7:00 p.m., for their monthly council meeting. Notice of the meeting was given by posting the agenda at the Town Hall, on the Town's website, and provision to the Carroll County Times. Mayor Jones presided over the meeting with councilmembers Donald Wilson; Laura Conaway; Amy Kalin; Cheri Thompson; Edgar Wentz; and Town Attorney, Mandi Porter. Councilmember Laura Conaway motioned to approve the October 2022 operating statements; October 24, 2022 council meeting minutes, October 24, 2022 closed session minutes, November 14, 2022 work session minutes and Quantum financial statements for October 2022. Councilmember Edgar Wentz seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

CARROLL MEDIA CENTER (CMC)

-CMC Executive Director, Richard Turner and Managing Editor – Digital Content, Bob Blubaugh, attended the meeting to discuss the possibility of streaming Union Bridge council meetings live. The fiber connection ends at the fire company. Union Bridge would have to have the fiber extended to the town hall. Councilmember Laura Conaway will speak with the Carroll Cable Regulatory Commission (CCRC) Chair, Mark Ripper to find out the process to have the fiber extended to Union Bridge Town Hall. Ms. Conaway will report back to Mayor and Council on the process and the next steps that need to be taken.

COMMUNITY CENTER WALKWAY ROOF PROJECT

-Funding for the walkway roof project has been secured with the FY22 Program Open Space (POS) grant. Union Bridge received three (3) bids.

S&K Roofing: \$ 5,937.00 Morris Brothers: \$ 4,685.00 Donald B. Smith: \$10,800.00

Councilmember Edgar Wentz motioned to accept Morris Brothers bid in the amount of \$4,685.00. Councilmember Laura Conaway seconded and the motion passed unanimously. Copies of the bids are attached to and made a part of these minutes.

FERGUSON METER TOP PROPOSALS

-Union Bridge received the results for the Beacon Orion Cellular Coverage Analysis. If Union Bridge decides to go with the Beacon Cellular AMI system, Union Bridge is 100% positive for AT&T coverage. After discussion, Councilmember Amy Kalin motioned to go with the Beacon Cellular AMI System, in the amount of \$101,879.00, with a yearly reoccurring Beacon Mobile Hosting Service fee, that will require increasing the base fee for Water and Sewer July 2023. Councilmember Cheri Thompson seconded and the motion passed unanimously. A copy of the proposals and the cellular coverage analysis is attached to and made a part of these minutes.

MAYOR'S REPORT

- -The AED's have been delivered. One will be installed in the Council Chambers and the other one will be installed in the Union Bridge Community Center.

ATTORNEY REPORT - MANDI PORTER

-Town Attorney, John Maguire, discussed the Forest Conservation Deed of Easement with Mayor and Council at the November 14, 2022, work session meeting. Town Attorney, Mandi Porter, stated that the Town shall have in its discretion to designate such portion of the easement as may be necessary to use for the operations and/or discharge associated with a wastewater treatment plant or facility planed for the lands adjacent to the easement. After discussion, Councilmember Laura Conaway motioned to approve the Forest Conservation Deed of Easement and to authorize Mayor Jones to sign it. Councilmember Donald Wilson seconded and the motion passed unanimously. A copy of the Forest Conservation Deed of Easement is attached and made a part of these minutes.

CARROLL COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE - DEPUTY COLUSSY

-Deputy Colussy reported that between the dates of October 23, 2022, until November 27, 2022, the Carroll County Sheriff's Office responded to 56 calls for service within the town limits of Union Bridge.
