PLEASE RECYCLE

The town's trash hauler, Maryland Disposal & Recycling, asked that we remind residents on the proper way to recycle.

- 1. PAPER: includes newspaper, office paper, junk mail, light cardboard, magazines, phone book, computer printouts, bags, non-metallic wrapping paper *dry*; *bundled in paper grocery bags or cardboard boxes*; *or tied securely with non-plastic string*.
- 2. COMMINGLED MIXED CONTAINERS glass (food & beverage containers only—unbroken). Tin, aluminum (food & beverage containers only); includes aluminum foil & disposable pans. Plastic (narrow necked bottles & jugs marked #1 PET or #2 HDPE), all the above are to be rinsed & free of food waste or other contaminants.

3. COMMERCIAL CORRUGATED CARDBOARD BOXES Folded flattened & dry

GRASS AND WEEDS

Ordinance #263, Sec C-2, Paragraph 2 states that owners and occupants of occupied premises and owners and persons in charge of unoccupied premises, including vacant lots, are hereby charged with the duty of maintaining any grass on such premises at a height of not more than six

(6) inches; and the further duty of maintaining such premises free of noxious weeds and dense underbrush.

SIDEWALKS

The town's inspector must inspect all sidewalk construction and repair.
