Holiday Cheer – Annual Christmas Tree Lighting

Union Bridge kicked off the holiday season with its annual Christmas Tree Lighting on December 4th at the intersection of Main Street and Broadway. Mayor Bret Grosnickle conducted the ceremony. The children were delighted to see Santa Claus ride in on a Harley Davidson to spread holiday cheer in the form of candy and traditional holiday greetings.

The next Funding Committee breakfast will be held on Jan. 19, 2003.

MAIN STREET REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

There is good news and bad news about the Main Street program. The good news is that the \$2.5 M in State and federal funding is still intact and available for the planned improvements to Main Street. The bad news is that the first round of bids received by the State Highway Administration (SHA) were high in price and therefore rejected. The SHA will re-bid the project in late January, with a new construction start date set for April 2003.

Main Street will be upgraded from the Rt. 75 intersection at North Main to the Brethren Church on South Main. Improvements to Main Street will involve construction and installation of the following new facilities:

- 1. Rt. 75 (Main Street) and several town side streets will be reconstructed and resurfaced.
- 2. All sidewalks will be replaced with decorative pattern/pressed concrete walkways
- 3. The existing curb and gutters will be replaced.
- 4. The storm drain system and inlets will be replaced.
- 5. New brick-patterned crosswalks will be installed at several intersections.
- 6. Decorative brick edging will be installed along the curb line.
- 7. A new eight-inch water main and service lines will be installed.
- 8. The current traffic signal at Main and Broadway, including the four metal poles, will be replaced with a new signal and only one pole.
- 9. A memorial area and parking will be located at the corner of Main and Broadway.
- 10. The overhead electric and cable wires will be installed underground at Main and Broadway.
- 11. All parking meters will be replaced with duel-headed meters, thus reducing the number of meters by half.
- 12. Decorative streetlight poles and globes will be installed along the roadway.
- 13. Safety improvements to the Lehigh entrance across from the 7-11 will be completed.
- 14. A park entrance and small parking area will be constructed for the Little Pipe Creek Park across from the gas station.
- 15. Upgrade and changes to landscaping, signs, parking, and other streetscape items along the roadway are planned.

The town will bid separately the undergrounding work for the overhead wires. Construction for this segment of the work should start in February 2003.
