We can't afford to be in a position where a violation occurs because of neglect. It is much better to plan for repairs and upgrades ahead of time.

The second issue that affects us all, though indirectly, is vandalism. Whenever picnic tables, walls, or playground equipment are damaged, we all pay to repair or replace it. I thank you in advance for your help in this matter.

ORDINANCE #263, SECTION C-2, PARAGRAPH 2

Owners and occupants of occupied premises and owners and persons in charge of unoccupied premises, including vacant lots, are hereby charged with the duty of maintaining any grass on such premises at a height of NOT MORE THAN SIX (6) INCHES: and further duty of maintaining such premises free of noxious weeds and dense underbrush.
