#### FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

Recent articles in the Carroll County Times spoke of the possibility of pharmaceuticals and personal care products (PCPs) in the water supply. This is just another emerging problem we will have to deal with, along with viruses, and disinfection by-products and other chemicals that inevitably show up in the water. Everything that we apply topically or ingest ends up in the waste stream which ends up in the streams and finally in the ground water. Nothing we do is without consequences, so the better we handle the use and disposal of everything from anti-bacterial hand soaps to prescription drugs, the fewer problems we will have down the road. Clean up is always more expensive and less effective than prevention and much can be lost or damaged beyond repair in the process. An informational flyer about the proper disposal of pharmaceuticals and PCPs is available at the Town Office. Please stop by and pick one up. You can also search the Internet for information on this and other topics of interest that will help to lessen our impact on the environment.

A separate but connected issue is playing out on the county scale that has to do with waste management. A proposal to join with Frederick County in the construction of a waste-to-energy incinerator is being considered by our Commissioners and will have a major impact on the environment in one way or another. By committing to a set amount of waste, which is necessary to make the project work monetarily, we will hurt the recycling program and any other efforts to reduce the waste stream. There are also the emissions from the incinerator to consider and the fly and bottom ash that will end up in a landfill. Take the time to research waste-to-energy

incineration, form your own opinions, and let the Commissioners know how you feel. This is a huge project that will have lasting effects on everything from our tax dollars to the environment.

- 8) Make it a habit to check your credit report.
