The Union Bridge Fire Company will be saying goodbye to one of its longtime dedicated members next month. Naomi Sinnott, on of the pegs in the foundation of the Union Bridge Fire Company will be leaving her lifelong home in Union Bridge to live with her daughter in Ohio.

Naomi Burrier married James Sinnott in 1951; shortly thereafter he convinced her to join the Ladies Auxiliary to the Union Bridge Fire Company where he had been a member since 1942. In 2004 her life companion died and Naomi began slowing down her activities at the Fire Company. Up until 2007, when her health declined, she was in charge of renting the social hall and organizing the many banquets, wedding receptions, funerals, and other functions held in the hall. There was never an event scheduled at the Fire Company that Naomi wasn't in the kitchen cooking from early morning until after the last person departed. On Sunday, September 9, 2007 from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m. the Union Bridge Fire Company will host an Open House to honor Naomi Sinnott for her many years of dedication and hard work with the Fire Company. # **RECYCLING NEWS**

Effective July 1, 2007 mandatory single stream recycling - everything in one container, no need to separate items. Recyclables will be picked up in regular trash trucks to be delivered to a recycling plant that will separate items.

Please note - do not call hauler if you see recyclables being put in trash trucks. Haulers will be using the same truck for each but at different times.

Plastic bags will not be allowed for use with yard waste. Craft bags must be used for curbside yard waste pickup. If you bring yard waste to the landfill in plastic bags you must empty them, not just drop them off.

Tipping fee will increase to \$61 a ton on July 1, cars remain at \$5.

\*\*\*PLEASE NOTE THAT YARD WASTE PICKED UP IN UNION BRIDGE DOES NOT GO TO THE LANDFILL. THE TOWN WILL CONTINUE TO USE BAGS THAT YOU CAN PURCHASE AT THE TOWN HALL FOR YOUR YARD WASTE. COST OF BAGS FOR THIS PRUPOSE IS \$1.00, WHICH HELPS DEFRAY THE COST OF THE YARD WASTE PICKUP SERVICE. \*\*\*

#### PAPER RECYCLING PROGRAM

The residents of Union Bridge are being given the opportunity to support the Carroll County 4-H Program in a fundraising program that does not cost anything. There is a bright green and yellow bin in the parking lot behind the Union Bridge Town Hall. Please bring all of the paper items that you would normally discard and throw them inside this bin. The recycling company picks up the paper and weighs it and the Carroll County 4-H Program receives a payment based on this amount. Every year more and more cuts are made in the amount of money that is allotted to the 4-H Program. This fundraiser will help to replace that money that has been cut and it does not cost you anything.

The following items can be put in the bin:

Newspaper, typing paper, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, shredded paper (which you can put in plastic bags) and paper.

The following items CAN NOT be put in the bin:

Phone books, cardboard, cereal/food boxes, folders, trash.

Every little bit helps. Please bring all of the paper that you normally discard and put it in the bin behind the Town Hall.

This recycling program is available to anyone - both residents and businesses in the The Town of Union Bridge are more than welcome to place their discarded paper in the bin. Thank you for your support.
