Grant Project Update
Union Bridge Community Park Trail System —

The Town of Union Bridge has completed its Community Park Trail System. The trail starts behind the new storage building at the large baseball diamond, directly across the street from the Shriner Court Homes. It wraps around the park and ends at the bottom of the Community Center staircase.

Farquhar Street Sidewalk Construction —

Construction of new sidewalks on Farquhar Street is planned to start this summer. The town is nearly ready to go out for bids. Funding for the sidewalks is through the Department of Housing and Community Development's CDBG program and The Town of Union Bridge. There will be no cost to the property owners for these improvements.

Union Bridge Waste Water Treatment Plant Backup Generator —

The Town of Union Bridge is seeking grant funding from the Maryland Department of the Environment to purchase and install a new backup power generator for the town's Waste Water Treatment Plant. Bids were due for the project on Monday, June 15, 2009.

Ordinance Reminders:

ORDINANCE 3263, Sec. B-1, Paragraph 1

Owners and occupants of premises fronting upon any street, with paved gutter and sidewalk, shall keep such gutter or sidewalk free and

clean of all filth, dirt, earth, snow, ice or any other obstruction of any kind whatsoever, at all times of the year; and during the months of May, June, July, August, and September clear and clean of all grass or any other foreign substances growing therein.

ORDINANCE #263, Sec. C-2, Paragraph 2

Owners and occupants of occupied premises and owners and persons in charge of unoccupied premises, including vacant lots, are hereby charged with the duty of maintaining any grass on such premises at a height of not more than six (6) inches; and the further duty of maintaining such premises free of noxious weeds and dense underbrush.
