Greetings Union Bridge! I hope this issue finds everyone well. With the arrival of warmer weather (finally), we are beginning to see more and more people, especially children out riding their bikes. As an avid bicycle rider myself, I thought I would pass on some bicycle riding safety tips. From the National Highway Tr4affic Safety Administration – "seven smart Routes to Bicycle safety:"

- 1. Protect your head. Wear a Helmet. Head injuries are the most common cause of death for bicyclists.
- 2. Assure bicycle readiness. Ensure proper size and function of bicycle.
- 3. Ride wisely. Learn and follow the rules of the road.
- 4. Be predictable. Act like the driver of a vehicle.
- 5. Be visible. See and be seen at all times
- 6. Drive with care. Share the road.
- 7. Stay focused. Stay alert. Motorists, keep an eye out for children on bikes, especially as they are apt to suddenly appear from between parked cars or leaping off the sidewalk!

Grant Project Update

Union Bridge Community Park Trail System -

The Town of Union Bridge is nearing completion of its community Park Trail System. The trail starts behind the new storage building at the large baseball diamond, directly across the street from the Shriner Court development. It wraps around the park and ends at the bottom of the Community Center staircase. The trail is expected to be completed by the first of May.

Farquhar Street Sidewalk Construction -

Construction of new sidewalks on Farquhar Street is planned to start in early summer. The town will have the first set of plans open for public comment (residents along Farquhar Street will be given notice when the plans are available). Grant funding for the sidewalks is through the Department of Housing and Community Development's CDBG program. There will be no cost to property owners for the improvements.

Recreational Ball Fields -

The Town is working with the West Carroll Rec. Council to locate land for recreational ball fields. If anyone has any information on available land, contact the town office.
